Pikes Thrive Under New Greek Code of Conduct

Greetings from Dodd Hall!

ADJUSTMENTS AND DETERMINATION

These words aptly describe the focus of our chapter and Dodd Hall. The adjustment portion centers around two major issues: (1) our last year as a "wet" house, and (2) Miami's new code of conduct for its Greek organizations.

Because we are a "wet" house, sophomores were not allowed to live in the Pike house this year. This regulation, combined with five upperclassmen not returning to Miami this year, has left our live-in number of 27 lower than normal. Hence, Dodd Hall's operating revenue has been reduced. But, since the housing corporation has no urgent and costly improvement or maintenance needs, our cash flow should be fine, according to **Steve Rohe '71**, Dodd Hall treasurer. As sophomores are again allowed to live in next year, this situation should greatly improve.

The chapter is also adjusting to Miami's new Greek Code of Conduct. After last spring's highly publicized, embarrassing, and unruly Greek events, stricter guidelines were called for. President David Hodge mandated a new policy be in place by the start of the school year. Our academic advisor, Jerry Miller, was instrumental in coordinating the Greek community and the Student Affairs office during the drafting of this code of conduct. Jerry's proactive approach ensured plenty of Greek input, as well as a fair and well-written policy for all involved. The new code was approved by all the fraternities and sororities the day before classes began. Highlights of the code include required security for all sponsored events outside of Oxford, sober liaisons, and a Thursday-Sunday time frame for all social events. Our chapter quickly accepted and adjusted to the new guidelines.

Determination is what I see from the chapter and the officers this year. With a below-average recruitment of 17 tainting last year's chapter performance, this group is determined to improve in several areas, including running a strong recruitment program. They even invited former Recruitment Chairman, SMC, and National Chapter Consultant **Ethan Basch '06** back for special recruitment tutoring for our members. I also believe we have the strongest officers that we have had in many years in the top four positions. They are **Drew Doman '09**, SMC; **Ross Sinmkins '09**, THC; **Nick Malatestinic '09**, recruitment chairman; and **Mike O'Horo '09**, house manager.

CAMPAIGN RESULTS

Our summer campaign was extremely successful! Alumni brothers donated \$8,435. Pike Merit Grows with Time

Hindsight Helps Bob Riebel '66 Advise Actives

“Life is a series of experiments. College and the Fraternity provide a wonderful environment to explore.”



As a senior in high school, **Bob Riebel '66** didn't want to join the military, get married, or get a job. That left one option: college. The first-generation college student hadn't even heard of a fraternity when he came to the Miami campus. Once he grasped the idea, though, he admits he joined Pi Kappa Alpha for “all the wrong reasons.” In addition to the attraction of a brand new, never-been-lived-in house, Bob's intentions “were short-term and not at all altruistic. The Fraternity offered me friendship. I was introverted and wouldn't have otherwise gone out of my way to be a people person.”

Although it's tough to agree that fostering lifelong friendships isn't a good intention, with time, Bob has grown to appreciate the other benefits of the Pike brotherhood. Charged with the task of running the Pike kitchen, Bob learned how to handle the logistics of planning and serving meals—without the aid of calculator or computer. “Paper and pencil: That was only one step above carving it in stone.” With or without technology, Bob's experience managing the budget, tackling repairs, and attending meetings taught him skills for life beyond the walls of Pi Kappa Alpha. “The Fraternity was a wonderful, useful real-world experience,” he says.

After earning a bachelor's degree in psychology and a minor in teaching, Bob tested his own ability to compose lectures for seven years as a high school social studies teacher. The classroom wasn't the right match, though, so he spent the next 14 years at GE in production control, running the Employee Store, and in inventory control. It was there that Bob at long last found his calling; he stayed in the inventory field for the rest of his professional pursuits. “I was in my late 30s by the time I finally decided on a career,” he advises. “Life is a series of experiments. College and the Fraternity provide a wonderful environment to explore; undergraduates should experiment as much as possible to find what they want to do.”

Now that he's retired, the chapter advisor and Dodd Hall trustee's focus has once again turned to ensuring all the maintenance is completed on the aged chapter house. That, and confronting a to-do list at home that has been building up for the past 30 years. While he's contemplating his next chore, Bob enjoys reading, traveling, biking, hiking, and observing the differences—and similarities—between his student advisees today and his own generation.

“I'm sure they're not any goofier, more disorganized, or worse time managers than we were. But, as you get older, you remember how much better you were! My favorite memories are going to bull sessions; getting together in someone's room, swapping opinions, and solving the world's problems. It's most interesting, as a former teacher, to see how today's Fraternity brothers are so different, but still so much the same as we were. The world they live in is different, so working with them gives me a broader, intergenerational perspective.”
