

It's a great time to be an alumnus of the Delta Gamma Chapter. Our new alumni relations program is off to a tremendous start, reuniting our alumni from across the U.S. Here is a summary of what the Dodd Hall Board of Trustees has accomplished over the past nine months. We have:

- Resurrected and improved our *Pikes' Peak* newsletter.
- Found and/or corrected countless mailing and e-mail addresses from our 1,500 Pike alumni.
- Received our official Delta Gamma Alumni Association Chapter from Pi Kappa Alpha International in February.
- Developed and activated our own interactive alumni Web site.

- Commenced an annual gift-giving campaign to fund the alumni relations program and undergraduate needs.

Support for the alumni relations program has been astounding! In the first six weeks after our initial appeal, \$8,000 poured in from generous alumni all across the states. Averaging more than \$100 each, checks for \$10 to \$1,000 arrived daily, along with touching sentiments and encouragements. Gifts have continued to arrive, along with notes from brothers I haven't heard from in years. What a wonderful feeling! Dodd Hall Board members and I couldn't be more proud, and we can't thank every one enough.

The undergraduate chapter has had a great start to the new semester. There are currently 14 quality men pledging the

fraternity; the chapter has been involved with multiple philanthropies; the undergraduates recently had a successful fundraiser with a local business; members' mothers enjoyed Mom's Weekend in early March; and a number of Pikes are making a name for themselves with their own personal successes.

The site will host many features (see next page for more details), which include an alumni directory, a bulletin board, a calendar of events, photo galleries, archived *Pikes' Peaks* newsletters, composite pictures, Dodd Hall meeting minutes with treasurer's report, alumni profiles, and links to other Web sites.

Everyone on the board is excited to offer this Web site to alumni because we know it will be a great tool for brothers to reconnect with one another and stay up to date with current events of each other and the chapter.

The board can only continue to provide newsletters and the Web site with the active participation of the brothers and through your donations or payment of dues. Membership is inexpensive—\$25 per year—and is automatically covered with donations of, or greater than, that amount. 

- **HOME PAGE WITH DIRECTORY**

- **ALUMNI DIRECTORY DATABASE**

You need to register and choose a user name online before being able to access the alumni directory. All other areas of the Web site are accessible without the use of a password. Nobody, even other Pikes outside of the chapter, will be given authorization to enter the database. Once you have been confirmed, your four-digit password, a function of your initiation or roll number, will be e-mailed to you. Only that password and unique user name will allow you to access the database.

*We need to develop an accurate listing of each year's officers. If you held one of the following offices as an undergraduate, please let us know: SMC, IMC, SC, and THC.

- **ALUMNI UPDATES**

A form is available to submit change of address, phone number, e-mail, etc. Please take time and scroll through the database for the years you were in the chapter. Submit any information that might be useful in locating lost brothers, either by e-mail or through the online form. This networking will be a great way to update and maintain an accurate database.

- **BULLETIN BOARD**

This is the place to submit short blurbs about your personal life: job changes or promotions, new children/grandchildren, moves, etc.

- **PHOTO GALLERY**

Photos of alumni and events submitted for inclusion should be scanned at 300 dpi and saved in a .jpg format. Identifying information should include names, years of initiation, and description of picture. Large collections of photos of major events will be collected and stored on the Kodak Easy-Share Gallery Web site for anyone to view. A hyperlink will be posted under the title of the event.

- **CALENDAR**

Will show upcoming events by month.

- **ALUMNI PROFILES**

We will profile two or three distinguished alumni each quarter. Past profiles will be archived to a Hall of Fame for permanent reference. If you have received some recognition in your job or other areas of your life, please let us know.

- **ARCHIVES OF PIKES' PEAK NEWSLETTERS**

Past *Pikes' Peak* newsletters in Adobe .pdf format will be available for online reading.

- **COMPOSITE ARCHIVES**

We are always looking to add composites to our collection. If you still have a composite in good condition and would like to help build the archive, scan it at 300 dpi resolution and save it in a .jpg format. If you don't have a scanner, take the composite to the Kinko's nearest you, have them scan it for you, and store on a CD-Rom. You can send the .jpg file via e-mail to wholetooth@aol.com or mail by snail mail.

- **DODD HALL BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

Includes list of trustees, officers, pictures, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses.

- **DODD HALL MEETING MINUTES/ TREASURER'S REPORTS**

The past several years of Dodd Hall minutes, as well as all future minutes will be archived in Adobe .pdf format for online viewing.

- **LINKS**

Includes International Web site, Delta Gamma undergraduate chapter, Miami University, MU athletic office (for event ticket purchase), and MU Alumni Association Web site. Brothers with personal or business Web sites are invited to submit the URL for inclusion.

MOM'S WEEKEND





Multi-Talented Delta Gamma Has Expansive Career

ALUMNUS SPOTLIGHT:
GEORGE H. ZIMMERMAN '47



George H. Zimmerman '47 is an accomplished teacher, composer, entertainer, and chef who has a career so packed with achievements it boggles the mind. Some of his most noted achievements include winning a Television Academy Emmy Award for creating and hosting several Sunday morning shows, writing a children's songbook and a cookbook, giving lectures on music history, and serving as Pi Kappa Alpha's national song director from 1951 to 1980.

George joined Delta Gamma as a senior at Miami University after being requested by **Bob Pierce '47**. Delta Gamma had a colony of PKAs and was composed mostly of former military men who returned to the university to study. They needed a song leader, and George was a perfect fit. He had to be initiated quickly since his graduation was just months away.

Initiation was on Valentine's Day of 1947, and the ceremony was held at Grey Gables Restaurant after hours. George says, "It was the first ceremony they had performed on their own. Everyone was pretty excited but unprepared. I ended up supplying some candles, a red drape for the altar, and a Bible for the ritual. We successfully followed the ritual and, in the end, were all brothers."

Upon graduation, George landed a job as the night manager for the new student union, the Redskin Reservation. That year,

the university offered a master's degree in music history, so George accepted a two-year teaching fellowship, then served as an instructor in the music department. He taught for three years after receiving his master's, all the while still serving as the chapter's song leader.

In 1951, after the Cincinnati convention, George was appointed national song director when Dr. George Krueger of Indiana University resigned. "Little George," as he was dubbed, held the position for nearly 30 years. He attended national conventions, encouraged chapter singing, edited a pocket songbook titled *Brother's Sing Out* for the national convention, and wrote several songs for the national fraternity. In 1972, George was awarded the Outstanding Alumnus Award by the chapter.


In 1953 George moved to Dayton, Ohio, where he taught elementary school music in the public schools.

Each Sunday from 1968 to 1975, George was creator and host of *Passport to Music*, a weekly television program on WLW-D. The show featured all kinds of music: Ethnic, Appalachian, chamber, Dayton school performances, as well as his own love—Tin Pan Alley tunes. Since the studio had a moveable kitchen set, he used it to feature cooking themes with himself as chef! In 1973,

he won a Television Academy Emmy. George received no payment for any of the programs; they served as a showcase for the talent of young musicians from the greater

Dayton community. George later hosted a 13-week series over public broadcasting titled *By George*, continuing the same format.

George's culinary creations were published in a book, *Everything Reminds Me of Food*, which went on for a second-edition printing. He has also written and published a children's holiday songbook, *Seasons in Song*.

George retired in 1978, as supervisor of music, after 30 years of teaching in the public schools. He then joined the faculty of the University of Dayton as a lecturer in American Music History until 1994. Currently retired and living in Naples, Florida, George still teaches, giving a series of lectures, "Our American Music Heritage," now in its sixth season at the Naples Philharmonic Center for the Arts.

On February 24, 2005, Delta Gamma alumni gathered from around the country at the home of **Brad Prokop '51** in Fort Myers, Florida, to honor George with a surprise party for his lifetime of achievements. The party began with a social hour, followed by a catered dinner. Between courses, many stories were recounted about the guest of honor. Lots of laughter ensued, and George responded with several of his own stories. Following dinner, guests were treated to Bananas Foster in the courtyard. Much laughter and many remembrances were enjoyed by all.


